<p>StudyLadder games</p> <p>Practise linking your times tables multiplication facts to your division facts. For example if you know $3 \times 4 = 12$ then you know $4 \times 3 = 12$ and $12 \div 3 = 4$ and $12 \div 4 = 3$</p> <p>BIG MATHS</p> <p>Log onto bigmaths.com (Instructions are on the glow group Gp-Primary 3)</p> <p>When you are in Big Maths there are 3 challenges that you can complete- they are the on-line versions of what we complete in class. You can only do each of these once a week. Full details are with the logon information.</p> <p><i>I am not suggesting that we use Easimaths for the time being as it has been too unreliable lately.</i></p>	<p>Log onto Oxford Owl via the glow tile or google. Remember to predict what your story might be about and afterwards summarise the story (written or telling someone) in your own words. You can also play the activities linked to your book (see the 'buttons' above the book). If it is a fact book, can you tell someone 3 or 4 facts that you have learned from your reading?</p> <p>Magenta Monkeys: Skills and Thrills</p> <p>Yellow Yaks: Histories Marvellous Mistakes</p> <p>Blue Birds: Tom, Dad and Colin</p> <p>On Oxford Owl find the book 'Everybody Worries'. After reading the book, design a new front cover for the book. Don't forget to include the title and authors name, but put your name as the illustrator.</p> <p>Spelling- see separate document with revision work</p>	<p>Joe Wickes workout (You tube)</p> <p>Help sort the washing.</p> <p>Practise skipping. If you can skip already, can you think of a different way to skip, for example backwards?</p> <p>Play 'The minister's cat'. Everyone takes a turn to describe the minister's cat using an adjective starting with the different letters of the alphabet in order. For example the minister's cat is an <u>angry</u> cat, the minister's cat is a <u>bonny</u> cat, the minister's cat is a <u>colourful</u> cat etc. Remember to only use adjectives (describing words), not just any word that starts with the correct letter.</p> <p>Brain Teaser: What question can you never answer yes to?</p> <p><i>Last week's teaser answer- You were the driver of the bus, so the bus driver's hair is the colour of your hair!</i></p>	<p>ICT- Complete this weeks Kodable challenge No. 6- Variables) You can find access to this on our group email.
