Parent Helpers - We are delighted to offer parent helper opportunities enabling parents to have greater involvement in the Bothwell Primary School community. Mr Frame shall be "canvassing" for helpers for one-off events and also to assist in school on a regular basis. Period Poverty - I wish to make you aware that we have free and readily accessible sanitary products for our young women. These are located in every toilet cubicle in the senior girls' toilets and are also always available at the school office.

Stationery Pack - Being mindful of the Cost of the School Day, using our Equity funding, all of our pupils have received stationery containing all the ingredients to being a super student! All are now ready and raring to go and learn!

Promoting Positive Behaviour - As a school, we have agreed to have one school rule:
"Do as you are asked". We aim to work in a mutually respectful environment, with a calm ambience.
Every year, everyone at Bothwell Primary, all pupils and all members of staff, work so hard to promote positive behaviour, by following our "Go for Green" positive behaviour guidelines. At a whole school assembly, the children have been reminded of the importance of ensuring their good behaviour commences at the start of term and permeates all areas of the school and to all members of our school community. The children have adhered to this beautifully this session and we have got off to a marvellous start, which shows no sign of waning - well done everyone for pulling together to make Bothwell Primary be the best it can be! Every year we see an increase in the number of children who not only receive a Gold Award each term, but who turn that into a Platinum by having "All Golds". At the end of session, we have a Go for Green Treat to reward the good behaviour of our children. This is a positive approach to encouraging good behaviour and the increase in the numbers is evidence of its success. The guidelines of the system were issued to all new pupils at the start of term. If you have lost your copy from last year, please see the school website for a reminder of the procedure we follow.
Please continue to support this system as positively as you have in previous sessions, as the children's intelligence and maturity has been evident in their response to Go for Green and all agree it has made the school a very fair and pleasurable place to be!

Fundraising - As you will appreciate, fundraising looked quite different in the past few years. However, as you will be aware from the Calendar shared on the school website recently, we are now returning to business as normal, having reinstated most of our previous fundraising approaches, such as our Lovely Ladies and Marvellous Men stalls and our fabulous Christmas Fayre, which is our main fundraiser of the session. The date of the Christmas Fayre is Saturday $25^{\text {th }}$ November.
Our Parent Council meetings, at which the finer details of this event shall be determined, shall commence on Monday $9^{\text {th }}$ October - more details to follow, from Celeste Majcher, our Parent Council Chair.
We will however also continue to fundraise in ways which are in line with our Cost of the School Day approach of promoting equity and equality. Some of the fundraising opportunities are below, e.g. if you shop online and have not get joined up to our easyfundraising account (see below), then please join as soon as possible. It is free to join but the commission from your purchases raises funds for the school - at no cost to you! A win-win situation!
In addition, if you have been clearing out your cupboards and wardrobes - please bring your items for recycling to the school by 3rd November, when we have our next uplift. All proceeds from Cash 4 Clothes, go to school funds. Challenge Poverty Week, including Money Week - The economy and the updates on the cost of living are regularly in the news at the moment. As such, this session we are introducing, in conjunction with our Money Week, a week where we shall Challenge Poverty and increase children's awareness of managing finances and living within their means. Equity Committee - We are currently in the process of setting up our Equity committee. This committee will be made up of all stakeholders of the school; parents, staff and children. Thank you to our parents who have volunteered to be part of this committee. We are still looking for further parents to join. If you are interested, please contact the school office. Mrs Jamieson shall be in touch to arrange our first meeting soon. One of the committee's key roles shall be to decide how to spend our participatory budgeting funding. The Equity Committee shall also ensure we are considering the Rights of the Child within the school and also continuing with our drive to be a more equitable school.
Dress Down Day - We shall be having our first Dress Down Day for this session, on Friday $13^{\text {th }}$ October. On this date, children should pay £1 if they can, to raise funds for Meningitis, our chosen charity focus for this session. We shall be visiting this subject at whole school assemblies, to raise the awareness of Meningitis. The £1 donation shall be split between our school's chosen charity this session and the school funds.

Cash 4 Clothes－As stated above，each term，we have an uplift from our recycling bin in the playground． The next uplift is Friday $3^{\text {rd }}$ November．Many thanks to all who have contributed items over the past few years as the funds raised by this means，have helped boost our school funds．

－This session，we have 18 returning children and 13 new starts，to date．Our pre－schoolers have returned to Bothwell Primary Nursery Class and we have welcomed our new children into the nursery class．Drop off is 9 a．m．and collection is at 3p．m．Children should come dressed for all weathers．We aim to have the children outdoors as much as they are in indoors．Please take a moment to look at our noticeboard in the nursery foyer．All key information is displayed here and shared on the Learning Journals．
－Infection prevention and control－We shall continue to practise good levels of hygiene with regular hand washing and daily cleaning of our playroom，resources and outdoor area．
－Care Plans－are being regularly updated．The nursery team will inform you about your child＇s Care Plan appointments．Please ensure all named contacts are up－to－date and staff know who will collect your child．It is very important to share all details on your child＇s Care Plan．
－Food－Your child will have a snack at nursery．The snack is free－flow and available for your child throughout the day and water is always available for the children．If you send a water bottle with your child，please ensure their name is clearly marked on it．The children will select their own lunch each day． A hot or cold lunch is provided for each child including a carton of milk．Children are encouraged to try our lunches and our catering staff are especially helpful in meeting individual needs and requirements． You can see the lunch choices on the South Lanarkshire Council website．
－Learning Journals are an important method of sharing the learning and stories from the nursery class． Please access them regularly．If you require any assistance with this，please speak to a member of the nursery staff team．We would also recommend uploading learning from home，so we can share their achievements with them．
－Our planning＂in the moment＂responds to children＇s needs and interests．Staff are planning daily experiences and adapting to what the children need，supporting and encouraging them to grow and develop．
－If your child requires medication，appropriate medical forms need to be completed．All medication must be prescribed and labelled．Please speak to Ms Talent for more information．
－Can you help please？－If anyone has any unwanted household items（e．g．kitchen utensils，vases，picture frames etc．）to make our home area more realistic，any donations will be welcome．We are also looking for any games，toys，dolls，doll houses，play items and loose parts like shells，acorns and twigs for play in our P1 classes．Finally，any children＇s clothing or footwear would be gratefully received too！Thank you for all the donations，so far．

Nut allergies - A further reminder that due to a number of children in the school having nut allergies, any snacks being brought into the school must not have any traces of nuts in them. This includes Nutella chocolate spread.
