Improvement Plan this session known as School Recovery Plan 2020-21

Every session the school compiles an improvement plan, based on the views of all stakeholders. Below are detailed the action points and our next steps we have taken or plan to take, to achieve them. If you have any questions in this regard or feel you could contribute to improving our school, please contact me.

In session 2020-21, the School Improvement Plan is a Recovery Plan which is focussing on the following:

Improvement Priority 1 - Promote the positive health and wellbeing of children & young people, parents/carers and staff:

Promoting the positive health and wellbeing of children and young people, parents/carers and staff; ensuring wellbeing, equality and inclusion. This will be done by focussing on whole school wellbeing and the Health and wellbeing curriculum.



Next steps:

- Following staff training on attachment and resilience, share attachment principles with parents.
- Further develop parental engagement opportunities whilst maintaining social distancing and reduced contact; e.g. School assembly, class assembly, parents' night; these areas can be looked at with a view to having virtual events, enabling parents to engage with their child's learning as much as possible.

Improvement Priority 2 - Planning for Equity

Planning for equity by re-identifying the poverty-related attainment gap and planning to close this gap and reduce learners' barriers to learning, whilst being mindful of the Cost of the School Day for our families. Through tracking and monitoring we shall determine the impact of equity approaches.

Next steps:

- Following a rigorous analysis of the pre and post lockdown data with all relevant staff, establish the school's new "gap" position. Identified groups/learners/stages requiring additional support are being targeted.
- Currently undertaking class visits and having staff and pupil dialogue to monitor learners' engagement, participation and involvement.
- Continuing to reinforce Growth Mindset
- Finding new ways for consultation with staff, pupils and parents to inform planning.
- Updating programmes to approaches in literacy, numeracy and health and wellbeing being implemented and prepared for blended/home learning.
- Providing advance notice for parents of any activities and events that have a cost involved and subsidising
 costs where possible and particularly where need arises. Please note that expenses will be minimal this
 session through restrictions on visits and visitors.

Improvement Priority 3 - Continuity of Learning

Continuity of Learning both in school and when learning at home.

Next steps:

- Ensuring regular feedback and updates with information sharing to support parents engaged in home and school learning.
- Continue to liaise with parents and keep communication channels open and actions transparent.

Our aim is to ensure that we are as ready as possible for school closure or blended learning as directed by current guidance.

Learning Community Improvement Plan

- Embedding moderation of numeracy, reading and writing.
- Developing a Learning Community Google Classroom, across our schools by sharing good practice.


All stakeholders will be consulted over the development of these areas.
