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Literacy

The class will complete the novel 'The Desperate Journey' that will link into learning in our new topic. We will then read '1918' which follows the story of a young soldier from Carlisle after WWI.

We will also have weekly comprehension sessions to develop the pupils' understanding of what they read.

In writing, the class will complete a variety of tasks learning all different styles of text.

Miss Nicoll will start a debating topic this term and pupils will discuss current news.

We will continue to develop spelling skills and strive for neat presentation in all learning.

Maths

In term 4, the class will learn about algebra, time, money, negative numbers, measure and shape. They will continue to develop their addition, subtraction, multiplication and division skills both written and mentally through SAMSON tasks.

Sumdog will continue to be available as a home learning task and it is important for the children to continually develop their times tables and number bond skills. This will ensure they can more easily complete new learning.

Curricular Areas

In ICT, office skills and coding will be developed. In PE, the children will be taking part in a range of different sporting games and athletics. Art and drama lessons will be linked to the topic. In music, the class will be learning new songs and looking at different instruments and will have the opportunity to try out new things. RME tasks will help the children learn about other world religions.

Topic

Our topic will be the World War 1. The class will learn about how the war began, who were the main people and countries involved and how it all ended. The class will then have a choice of what they would like to learn about for the rest of term 4.

In health this term, the class will learn about drugs and substance misuse and our growing bodies.
