In the News!

The Times Newspaper published a table of Primary school performances on 18th August and our school has been placed in the 'Top 5' on a score based on numeracy, reading, writing, literacy and talking data collected by the Scottish Government.

A group of schools all achieved a top score of 380 and the schools were then ranked on a deprivation factor. Newington is the highest placed in Dumfries and Galloway and there are only two from our region in the Top 50 for all of Scotland.

We are delighted with this recognition of all the hard work of our school community.

Specialist Input
