Start and Finish times

Nursery is open from 8.30am – 3.30pm Monday to Friday, term time.

Drop off and Pick up Arrangements

Our drop off is at 9am for most children. The nursery gate is open from 8.50am and parents should gather in the playground next to nursery.

At 9am children are welcomed in to nursery by their key worker. At pick up time parents are welcome to come into nursery to collect their child. This is an opportunity to ask any questions to your child's key worker about their day. Anyone collecting a child must be named on the care plan and over the age of 16.

Learning, developing and growing

Curriculum for Excellence

Curriculum for Excellence (CfE) is bringing learning to life in the way education is delivered for all 3-18 year olds - in nursery, primary, secondary, at college, workplace or community learning. It aims to raise standards, improve knowledge and develop skills, closing the gap between the lowest and highest performers. In our nursery the central focus is on play and all of the activities are spontaneous and informal. The nursery staff do plan the environment and resources from children's interests, which encourage the children's development and learning.

Absences and/or Illness

If your child is absent from nursery you should contact the nursery before 9.30am to inform us of why and how long you expect them to be absent.

If your child is going to be late or picked up early due to an appointment, you should inform your child's key worker the day before or contact the school office on the day to let us know what time they will be arriving or leaving. The same drop off and/or pick up procedure will be in place.
