Reminders

Literacy

This term we will be learning the sounds o, u, l, f, b, ai, j, oa, ie, ee/or, z, w, ng, v, y, x and oo.

The children will be learning to blend words using all known sounds. When they can confidently blend, they will be issued with Word Boxes.

In addition, the children will be learning to write words using all known sounds. They will be introduced to simple sentence construction.

Tricky words will be issued this term - please take time to practise these at home every day.

Oxford Reading Tree (ORT) characters and Stage I words will be issued on a weekly basis.

Curriculum

In PI, we learn through play which helps us to reinforce our learning within all curricular areas whilst developing independence, creativity, communication, problem solving skills, resilience and respect for others.

We will continually reinforce our classroom rules and routines and we will continue to encourage the children to establish and develop friendships.

Our topic for this term will be 'Celebrations'. We will be learning about Halloween, Bonfire Night, birthdays and Christmas. All children will receive input on a Wednesday from Mrs Carter for Music and Mrs Carruthers on Thursday for Mathematics, Nurture and British Sign Language (BSL).

Numeracy

We follow the Samson Maths programme of study which involves learning about number, money, addition and subtraction. At the Early Level, the children also learn about 2D/3D shape, pattern, direction, symmetry, time, measure and data handling.

This term, we will be counting orally to twenty and beyond. The children will learn to form the numbers 0-20. We will continue to focus on mathematical language - less than/more than, one/two more, largest/smallest and number after. The children will be introduced to the concept of addition and learn simple addition facts to five.

They will also develop an understanding of symmetry and handling data using pictograms and simple graphs.

Homework

Homework tasks will be sent home in homework folders and they will be posted on our PI ClassDojo page. Please check on a daily basis for new tasks, sign homework records and click 'like' on ClassDojo to show when they have been completed. Comments are welcome too if your child has completed this well or if they have had any difficulties.

Take time to practise all sounds, word boxes, tricky words, number formation and addition facts to five. Please take some time to share stories and play games with your child at home.

Also, children are welcome to bring in items from home to explore at our Investigation Station.
