In writing we will continue to focus on punctuation, using a variety of sentence openers, the conjunctions 'and', 'but' and 'because' as well as using wow words.

Maths



This term in Maths, we will continue to focus on 'Numbers to 1000 and money.

We will also look at Grid references, compass points, position and direction and time.
