What is my child learning about at nursery?

Please take the time to check what the children are learning about in nursery via the Planning shared in the 'News' section of the App or displayed on the noticeboard outside the nursery. Learning is a partnership between home and nursery so please have conversations with your child about what they learned in nursery and try out some of our activities to further support their progress.

Our BIG Question:

Each month nursery will ask parents for feedback on a topic we are reviewing or wanting parental input on. In December we asked whether you want your child to be allowed to play outside in wet weather, then changed into dry clothes afterwards. The national guidelines for this state that in free flow play children should be allowed to access outside play in all weathers, if it is safe to do so. The results were:

24 chose YES 27 chose NO

The result of this will help inform our discussions as to what steps we can take to ensure all children can access free flow play indoors and outside.

The children visited Lydiafield to sing the concert songs to the residents which everyone enjoyed and it was a great opportunity to practise our road safety and walking as a group. We will be continuing weekly visits this term in our key groups.
