PEEP

We are unable to offer our normal weekly PEEP session for parents, children and younger siblings so Ms McKeown will send out via the app a weekly activity for you to do with your child(ren) at home to promote family learning. This will start today - Friday 11th September. She will also send out a monthly survey to gather feedback on how these went and what types of activities you wish to do. Children learn best when supported by an interested adult who takes the time to ask them questions and promote their curiosity and problem solving and have fun with them too.

Personal Learning Profiles (PLPs)

We are currently changing over from paper PLPs to online ones using the 2 Build A Profile programme. This will enable staff to complete observations on children's learning and share them immediately to parents, as well as linking the learning to Curriculum for Excellence Early Level. We will share further information about this once it is ready.

What is my child learning about at nursery?

Learning through play is spontaneous and staff are trained in and practice what is known as planning in the moment; observing, assessing and then scaffolding learning and using HOTS (Higher Order Thinking Skills) questions with children to extend ideas, thinking and learning. More information will be sent to you on this later in the month.

Learning is also a partnership between home and nursery so please have conversations with your child about what they have been learning each day. If your child comes home with an 'Ask me About' sticker, please ask them about it.

Settling in progress reports will be issued before October holidays.

Our BIG Question / Parent Survey:

Each term in nursery we will would normally ask parents for feedback on a topic we are reviewing or wanting parental input on. Due to the current restrictions and our focus on health and wellbeing, communication and infection control we put a Parent Survey on the app to be completed. Thank you to everyone who has completed it and we will feedback the responses and actions later this month.

Community Walks:

The children are enjoying community walks out and about as part of their learning around road safety and staying together as a group. They are also able to learn about the world around them, looking for numbers and letters as well as talking about what they see and listening to each other. This also supports our active approach to health and wellbeing as the children are getting the health benefits of an extended walk. If you see us out and about with our fluorescent vests on, please say hello!

Words together / TLQ (Talking, Listening and Questions):

Words Together and TLQ are programmes which provide targeted activities for children who need some additional support to develop communication skills. Ms McKeown will be in touch directly with the parents of children to gain consent and will start to deliver these after the October break.

Outdoor Area:

Last year Newington was successful in being awarded funds from Tesco Bags appeal for an outdoor classroom/shelter to be built in the outdoor area. This is being designed and built by local joiner Kev Copland and will hopefully be completed during the October holidays.

The local authority is also extending our garden to give the nursery a grassed area for play. This work should commence soon and will not impact the children playing outside.

Outdoor Clothing:

Please ensure your child has appropriate clothing for all weathers when they come to nursery. All children will have access to outside in wet weather unless stipulated on their care plan.
