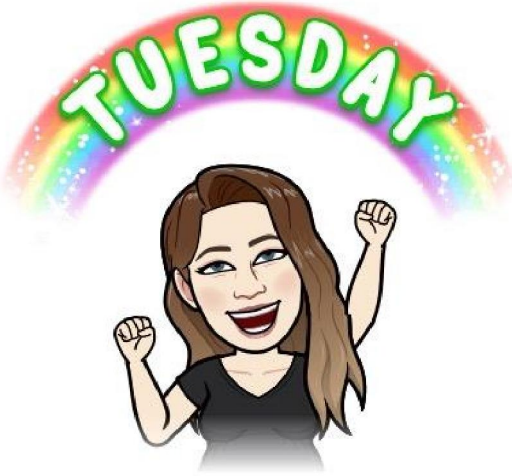


Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> June 2020

## Numeracy

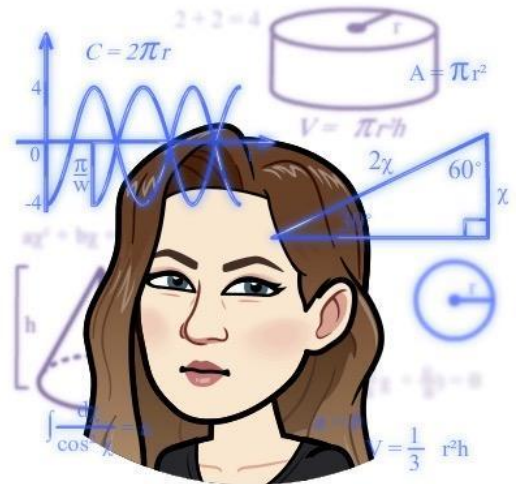
Watch the short video which will recap what we have learned about analogue time.

# Literacy



1. For your first task today, there will be an activity on See-Saw where some sentences about Stanley's Stick have become jumbled up. It is your task to put these in the correct order. You can choose whether you'd like to print them out, cut out the words and stick them in the correct order, write them in the correct order in your jotter, or record yourself saying the sentence onto See-Saw.
2. For your second task, I'd like you to use your questioning skills to discover what games the adults in your family used to play with nature. For example, when Mrs. Jackson was a little girl I would climb trees and build habitats for worms and birds with sticks and grass! Think carefully about what questions you'd like to ask adults. You can either let me know what you find out by writing it down or recording yourself on See-Saw.
3. Finally, try this game. You need to read two sentences and click on the one that makes sense. You will then collect jigsaw pieces to create a bigger picture.
