Topic for Primary 5	1. Read the Viking Runes Information (See resource Materials File)
	2. Try the Vikings Rune Message Worksheet (See resource Materials File)
	Perhaps when you are out for your daily walks you could collect some small stones, all roughly the same size. Bring them home and paint them lovely colours. When they are dry use a black marker and mark rune letters on them.  You will have your own collection of Viking runes. Take a photograph and post it with your Viking work. Topic for Primary 5/6	Thoose one European country as a focus for study. Make a front cover for your study and an opening Fact File which shows the name of the country, the flag, the population, the currency, what countries border it, what languages are spoken there, what famous people come from there.
	2. Find out the names of all of the countries which are in Europe. Find out what their capital cities are and what their flags are like. Make your own PowerPoint or Sway to show what you have learned.
