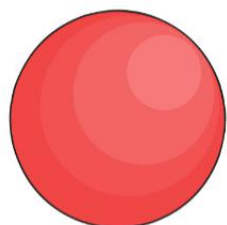
Numeracy

Today we will focus on our problem solving skills and I have found a game that links this with the shapes we have been learning about. For this game, you have to fit smaller shapes into one large shape. There are 3 levels of difficulty but I think most of you could manage medium to hard!

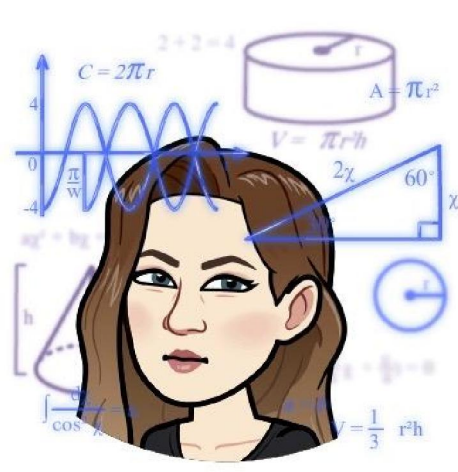

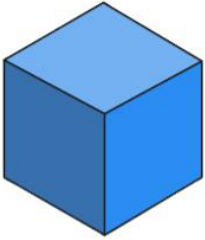

Remember:

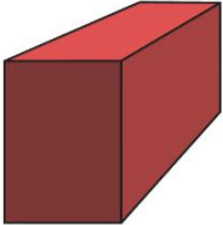


A sphere is round and smooth and shaped like a ball.





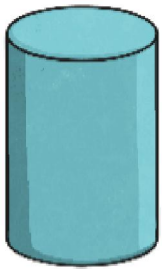
A cube has 6 sides and each flat side is shaped like a square.



This is a cuboid or a rectangular prism. It has 6 sides like a cube, although they are not all the same size. 4 are long rectangles, and the 2 at each end match in size. It looks a little bit like a cereal box.



This is a triangular prism. 3 of the long sides are rectangles and the 2 on the end are triangles. This shape resembles the roof of a house, a tent, or my favourite - a bar of Toblerone!



This is a cylinder. It has 1 side going all the way around the shape in a curve, and 2 flat circles on either side. You will find that this shape resembles a tin of beans!

Literacy



Today we will be creating a mind map again. You will be given a page from Toys in Space and you will try to create as many describing words as possible about what you see.

In the centre of your mind map you will write 'Night Sky'.

Next, write some describing words for the night sky you see in the picture around the centre of your mind map. Connect each word to the centre of the mind map with a line, just like you did the last time.

Remember to make sure that the words DESCRIBE the sky. You could talk about what it looks like, what you think it feels like, what it might smell like. Close your eyes and picture yourself there with the toys and see what you come up with.

Once you have finished, you can have another go at the phonics games I linked you yesterday. It is very important you get lots of practise with your sounds!
