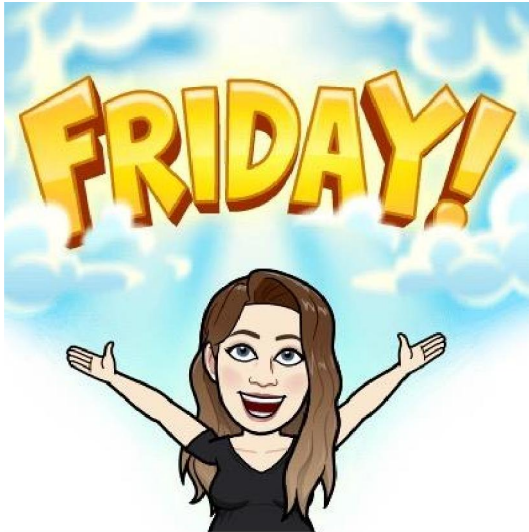


Friday 12th June 2020

Literacy

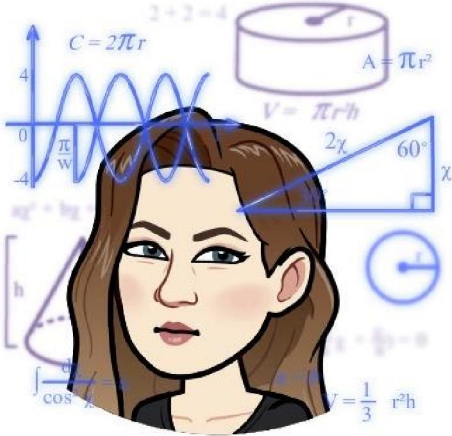
Whizz! Bang! Pow! Bam! Crash! Boom!

These words are all examples of **onomatopoeia**. We have learned a little bit about this before, but since we are learning about Traction Man and being a super-hero, it's the perfect opportunity to touch upon this again.

Onomatopoeia is a word that imitates the sound it is describing. Other examples would be WOOF or MEOW or OINK. I thought we could do an art activity based upon this today. I have pasted below several examples of how onomatopoeia is shown in comic books. Today I'd like you to have a think of as many examples of onomatopoeia as you can, then you will create your own onomatopoeic word in a piece of art. You could use paper and coloured pens/pencils at home, or if you are feeling creative you could even have a go at creating it on Paint on the computer. Try to think of any sounds you might hear in a Traction Man battle!



Numeracy



For your warm up task today, see if you can gather a selection of 2p, 5p and 10p coins. Practise your skip counting with the coins and see if you can count how much money you have!

There will then be a worksheet on See-Saw asking you to go on a shape hunt! We will be revisiting shapes next week so I thought it might be good to have a go at this today. On the sheet are some 2D shapes. You will go on a shape hunt (it could be in your house or outdoors - hopefully we get some sunshine!) and record each shape you spot with a tally mark. Which shape was the most popular? Which was the least popular?

If you would like to, you can finish off with a quick game of shape patterns.
