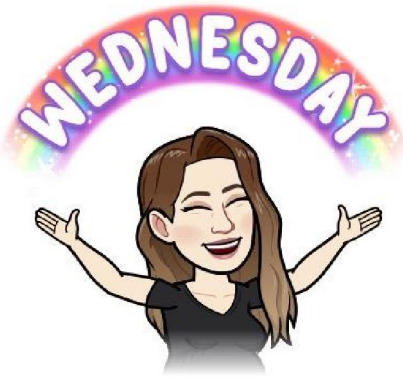

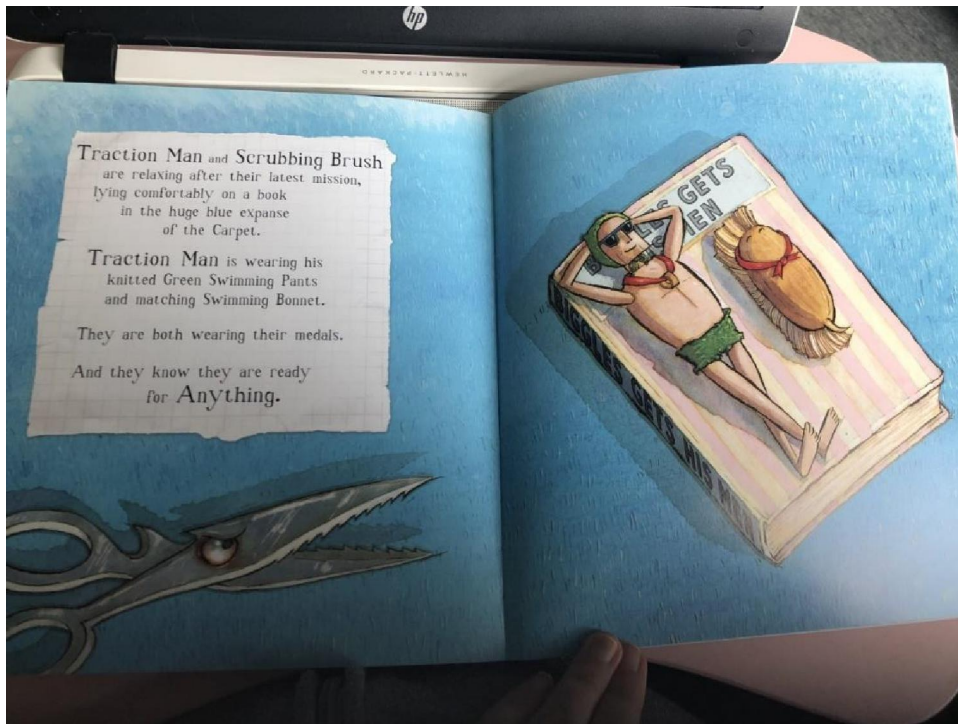

## Literacy

Today we will be doing some creative writing with our Traction Man story. At the very end, we see Traction Man and Scrubbing Brush floating in the 'ocean' looking very relaxed. However, you may have noticed that lurking in the corner of the page are a rather scary looking pair of sharp scissors!



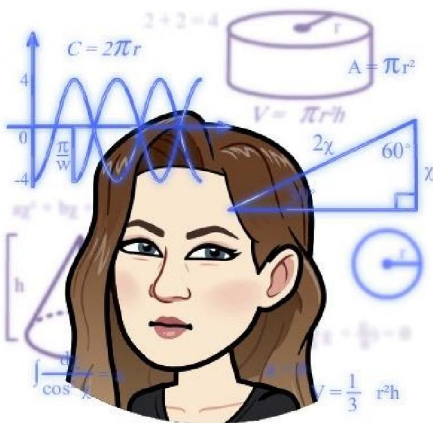
For today's writing task, I'd like you to write about what you think might happen next. You should plan what you want to write by first thinking about the following;

1. What is the name of this scary creature?

2. What will happen? Will it catch Traction Man and Scrubbing Brush? Will anyone else appear to save them? Will Traction Man react quickly? Did the scary creature turn out to be not so scary after all? The possibilities are endless, so get your thinking cap on!

3. How will it end? Will it be a happy ending? Will they be rewarded again? Will they all become friends? Will they be able to relax again? Give your story an ending.

Now you can start writing your story. You can write 1,2,3 or more sentences, whatever is manageable to you. As always remember to start each sentence with a Capital Letter, include a finger space between each word and end each sentence with a full stop. I look forward to seeing what you come up with! If you'd like, you could recreate your story with some of your own toys or household items!



## Numeracy

Today we will be revising our odd and even numbers. To start off, watch this video for a recap on what odd and even numbers are.
