<p><u>Topic (Expressive Arts)</u></p> <p>Try some shadow drawing with your toys! Lay a piece of paper on the ground outside with one of your toys at the edge. Position this so there a shadow placed onto the paper. Trace around the shadow.</p> 	<p><u>Topic (STEM)</u></p> <p>Why do you think the toys used parachutes to come back down to Earth? How do you think parachutes manage to slow them down as they fall from the sky? Can you think of anything else they could maybe use to slow the descent?</p> <p>Have a go at making your own parachutes. Place an egg in a paper or plastic cup, then find any items at home to attach to the cup that you could use as a parachute. It could be a napkin, a plastic bag, a cloth? Attach this to your paper cup and see if you can drop it from a height to test if it can carry the egg safely to the ground. There are lots of ideas on the internet if you're stuck!</p> <p>I can't wait to see your results!</p>	<p><u>HWB</u></p> <p>You may have seen on the news or heard adults talking about lots of protests happening all over the world just now. Talk together about the importance of showing respect, being kind, and embracing diversity.</p>
<p><u>Topic (STEM)</u></p> <p>Some of the toys in this weeks story need electricity to work. This means they need batteries but some toys can also be plugged into a power source. You must be very careful when using toys that need electricity to work. Talk to an adult at home about the possible dangers of electricity and create a poster warning your family to take care.</p>	<p><u>HWB</u></p> <p>It is important to know your address of where you live. If you were to get lost, someone who helps you will need to know where you live to help you return there safely.</p> <p>Learn your address. You could practise writing it down. Do not post this on See-Saw or anywhere else. We have already discussed in class that you should never tell a stranger where you live either. However it is important that you know this.</p>	<p><u>Expressive Arts</u></p> <p>Using recycling material from home, create your own alien! Think about what shape and colour your alien might be. How many arms and legs will you give it? Will it even have arms and legs? Be as creative as you can with egg boxes, cereal boxes and crisp packets!</p> <p>Give your alien a name and post a photo of it on See-Saw.</p>
