We have our school trip tomorrow, so today's tasks will be in preparation of that. I have dropped some more clues today and will reveal all tomorrow morning!

Literacy

When we go on a school trip, there are a few things that need organised and planned before we go! I have set aside some tasks below for you to choose from.



1. As we will be seeing some animals on our trip, why not try your best to think of an animal for every letter of the alphabet, just like we did with our toys. (ie. A - aardvark, B - bear, C - cat, D - deer...). Some of them might be tricky! There will be a template for this on SeeSaw.

2. On a school trip, the bus journey there can take a long time. Think of any songs you know or have learned in Primary 1/2 that we can sing on the bus. Write down the names of the song and share this on See-Saw.

3. Finally, as this is our final day in our virtual classroom, I'd like you to think of 3 things you have loved about Primary 1/2. You can write these in a sentence or record yourself on SeeSaw.

Numeracy



Before you head off on a journey, it is important to plan ahead and ensure that you are prepared and organised. Below are some tasks you can choose from to prepare for our school trip tomorrow.

1. We will be leaving on our bus trip tomorrow morning at 9am sharp! Prepare a timetable of your morning routine to ensure that you are all ready to go at the 9o'clock bell. Think about how long you might need, and what you need to do in the morning to get ready and prepared.
2. When Mrs Jackson was in Primary School, one of my favourite parts of a school trip was the gift shop at the end! Why not set up your own little gift shop at home by selecting any animal related toys or items around your home and labelling them with a price tag. You can then practise buying some of the items with any money you can borrow at home.
3. Design your own map. I can reveal that the trip will involve a variety of different animals. Some of them live in water, some live in trees, some live in fields. Create your own animal sanctuary map and ensure to label on the map where each animal lives. To help any guests to your sanctuary, it might be helpful to draw a path throughout your sanctuary to ensure every animal can be seen on the trip. You can choose any animals you like to live in your sanctuary.

Extra Activities

1. As our trip will take all day, it is a good idea to prepare a packed lunch that you can have. Tonight, why not help an adult prepare your lunch. Remember to keep safe when using any kitchen utensils, and clean up after yourself when you are finished. You could even practise cutting your food into halves and quarters like we did when we learned about fractions and sharing.

2. Finally, why not check the weather forecast for tomorrow. Most phones have an app that can tell us how to predict the weather, or you might want to watch the weather forecast on the television. We will be on the East Coast of Scotland, so fingers crossed it stays dry for our trip!
