The activities in the bottom row will rotate so that you can access different areas of the curriculum across the weeks.

<p>Topic</p> 	<p><u>Outdoor sound map</u> Explore the sounds you hear when outdoors. In your garden, or at the park, find a comfy place to sit with a pencil and paper. Close your eyes and listen carefully. What can you hear? Try drawing what you think it is. Try drawing it in the direction you think it is coming from.</p>	<p><u>Wildlife in your area</u> Go for a walk, make a list of all the different wildlife you see. Choose one animal you have seen to research. What can you learn about them? Make a poster to share your findings.</p>
<p>Expressive Arts</p> 	<p><u>Texture</u> Texture can be used to add interest to art work. Can you create a textured piece of art? Use dried pulses, dried leaves, sticks etc. Are you going to paint over them, or use them naturally? You can add to your creation in anyway you like.</p>	<p><u>Create a dance routine</u> Create a dance sequence to your favourite song. Can you plan out and practice your moves. Maybe you can get a family member involved too. I would love to see a video!</p>
<p>Health & Wellbeing</p> 	<p><u>Ball skills</u> If possible, get outside and practice your ball skills. Practise catching, throwing, dribbling, kicking and scoring.</p>	<p><u>Celebrating differences!</u> You might be seeing/hearing a lot on the news lately about protests around the world. <p>RME</p> 	<p><u>Love, kindness and sharing</u> In these difficult times there are a number of community groups working hard to support your community. Do you know of any? Is there any way you can help them? Or can you think of people in your community that you could help? Carry out an act of kindness for someone in your community.</p>	<p><u>Religion at home</u> Do you or anyone at home follow a religion? Or do you know anyone else who has religious beliefs? Ask them to talk about it with you to help develop an understanding of their beliefs and traditions. Once you have done this create an information poster to explain these beliefs to others.</p>
