


#### **Prince's Trust**

#### **Powering Futures Qualification**

Ten Senior Phase pupils from Mr Higgins
Criminology class successfully achieved their Level
6 'Powering Futures' qualification at the end of
March. The pupils had to work as part of a team
to come up with a viable solution to a
sustainability challenge set by sector leading
businesses. Over the course of the Challenge
Programme, they researched and collaborated on
a solution, concluding with a presentation to a
panel of industry judges. During the programme
they developed 'meta-skills' such as teamwork,
problem-solving, critical thinking and resilience skills vital for their future. The judges all
commended the pupils on their excellent
presentations.

Pupils' participation in the programme takes place over the three years of their senior phase (S4 to S6), and they cover everything from introducing pupils to the four professional subject areas in S4 to supporting their applications to these degrees in S6.

Just before Easter, 40 S4 pupils took part on an in-school **Reach Intro** session which also included information about the **ACCESS to a CAREER Programme**, focussing on those who are interested in a career in Accountancy, Primary Teaching or Engineering.

the Maths department. Well done!




#### **S4 Health Sector**

#### **Rights Respecting School Award – Silver**

This involved a rigorous accreditation process by UNICEF who read through our evidence pack and self-evaluation. It also involved a group of 12 young people and a panel of staff being interviewed by UNICEF to examine if Eastbank Academy met the criteria. Our feedback stated that 'The enthusiastic groups of young people were confident and assured in discussing rights, especially so when exploring important rights concepts such as universality and unconditionality'. We were awarded a very strong silver and look forward to progressing to Gold in school year 2024 - 2025!
