

Dear parents and carers,

A very warm welcome to the October 2024 edition of Academy News. It is nine weeks since we began academic session 2024-25. As always, the first term has been busy, with pupils settling in to their new year groups, getting to know new teachers, in some cases getting to grips with new subjects, and for our first-year pupils learning their way around a new school. All of this makes for a lively school, and I'm delighted to report that everyone has coped well with this.

We started the session very positively, with the tremendous news that our Senior Phase pupils had once again performed extremely well in their exams last summer, smashing all previous Eastbank records. We are incredibly proud of their achievements, and I was delighted to be able to congratulate many of them personally at our awards ceremony in September. You can find out more about both of these later in this newsletter.

Sticking with academic matters, S1 have had their first parents' meeting, and it was great to meet parents and carers and welcome them into our school. In addition, all year groups, with the exception of S3, have received their first tracking report of the session. S3 will receive theirs on Friday 25 October. These will be issued regularly throughout the year to keep you informed about your child's academic progress and prospects.

The term from October to Christmas is another nine-week stretch and will be fast and furious. Prelim exams begin on 2 December and there are six teaching weeks until these begin, so everyone will need to be working hard and stay 'on the ball'. Our supported study programme commences immediately after the holiday, and I strongly encourage al senior phase pupils to attend.

There have been a number of other more exciting (some might say more interesting) activities taking place across the school. We have had young people undertaking their Duke of Edinburgh Expedition, S4 pupils visiting Whitelee Wind Farm as part of the National 5 Energy course, and senior photographers undertaking their field trip, amongst many other activities. In the term ahead, we look forward to visiting the V&A museum in October and, looking further ahead, a trip to France beckons for some in the summer.

I am grateful to all parents and carers for their ongoing support, and to staff for going to great lengths to provide brilliant service for our young people, and making Eastbank the wonderful school it is. I wish everyone a relaxing October holiday.





AMBITION: MORE OUTSTANDING EXAM RESULTS IN 2024!


Another year, another set of records broken. Yet again, we were thrilled with the performance of our S4, S5, and S6 pupils in their 2024 SQA exams with a superb set of overall and individual results. Our S4 pupils achieved excellent results at National 3, National 4, and National 5 level. An amazing 33% of our S4 pupils achieved five or more passes at National 5 which, by some considerable distance, is the best performance by Eastbank Academy in at least 20 years.






Our rising school roll means that we are also seeing even greater *numbers* of pupils passing. For example, in 2019 we had 131 pupils in S4, 19 of whom achieved 5 or more passes at National 5 (14%). In 2024 we had 180 pupils in S4, 60 of whom achieved 5 or more passes at National 5 (33%), and we are also seeing pupils achieving better quality qualifications, with more now achieving passes at grade A or B. At National 3 and National 4 level, we are also seeing improvements, with the percentage of pupils achieving 3+ and 5+ National 3 and National 4 passes increasing from 2019.

The S5 Higher results for 2024 have been the best in over 20 years. In 2019, only one S5 pupil achieved 5 passes at Higher (AABCC). In 2024, this has increased to 15 pupils - 10% of the (bigger) year group. Two pupils achieved 5 passes at grade A, and a further two achieved AAAAB. Similarly, at 1+ and 3+ Highers, 2024 has been the best year on record at Eastbank Academy. Similar positive patterns can be seen at other levels and in other year groups.





The overwhelming majority of our leavers progress to a positive and sustained destination. A significant number of our leavers have secured university places, many having passed Advanced Highers both in school, and in collaboration with the AH Hub at GCU. In addition, we have many pupils progressing to study Engineering, Science, and Humanities courses at University, and others successfully achieved places to study HND/HNCs at college, as well as many more progressing on to apprenticeships.

We are very proud of our young people and extremely impressed with their achievements. Our new Senior Phase classes have made a magnificent start to their studies, and the first tracking reports indicate that the overwhelming majority of pupils are on track to achieve their targets this year.

Well done to all pupils on a successful year last session. Many thanks also to parents, carers and staff for supporting them throughout the year. This is what happens when pupils display ambition and take responsibility for their learning.
