<p>Phonics & Spelling ie and ee (revision) Select 2 activities from the spelling grid in the activities section using the words</p> <p>pie see lie bee tie teen cries keep flies feet</p> <p>Please complete 'ee' Look, say, cover, write, check sheet in activities section</p> <p>There is no need to print this out, you can write the words on a piece of paper.</p> <p>Word Box can you challenge yourself to move onto the next word box?</p>	<p>Reading <u>Oxford Owl Reading for Information</u> Help your child to explore the book 'Dinosaur Safari' at https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/api/digital_books/1242.html and answer the questions which accompany it in the activities section</p> <p>ORT – Please help your child to choose their own book from the Oxford Owl. Please don't worry if your child can not read all of the words independently. Please use the guided reading cards in the activities section to help your child with their comprehension skills.</p> <p><u>Jolly Phonic Sounds</u> In the activities section we have uploaded Jollyphonics flash cards. Please show them to your child and practice their recognition of the sounds.</p> <p>Writing <u>Dictation practice</u> using word box words you have been practicing (or you could start with word box 1 and move through the scheme) read the word out to your child and ask them to write it down. If your child copes well with this you could ask them to write a simple sentence using a full stop and a capital letter.</p> <p><u>Annotated diagram</u> Can you draw a picture of a dinosaur and label the different parts? You could look at the pictures in the 'Dinosaur Safari' book above for some ideas. Will your dinosaur be a herbivore or a carnivore? Will it have a long neck or sharp teeth? Will you create your very own dinosaur that has never been thought of before?</p> <p>Can you write a few sentences describing your dinosaur? You could start by saying My dinosaur is... It likes to eat... It does not like...</p> <p>Remember to use capital letters, a full stop and finger spaces. Your child may be able to write words and sentences independently or they may need more help to come up with ideas and to copy words. Please encourage any attempts at spelling!</p>	<p>Money – Please complete the 2 games in the activities section orally. There is no need to print them out. They will help your child to recognise coins and make amounts.</p> <p>Money - The following game will help your child to recognise coins as well as sort them from smallest to largest amounts. https://www.topmarks.co.uk/money/coins-game</p> <p>Addition It is important that your child has a good foundation of number bonds. This game will help them become faster at answering mental maths questions https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/hit-the-button</p> <p>Subitizing is when your child recognises a group of objects or dot patterns without having to count them every time. The children love Jack Hartman and this is a super way of learning to subitize in lots of different ways. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=A1Mazc-SsG0</p> <p>Please show your child the Subitizing using dice activity in the activities section. This will help your child to recognise amounts as well as help them to add amounts together by counting on.</p>
