Get an adult to show you a variety of times (o'clock, quarter past, half past and quarter to) and tell them what time they are showing.</p> <p>Can use 'Teaching Clock' on https://www.topmarks.co.uk to do this.</p>	<p>Go on to YouTube and follow on of the Body Coaches workouts.</p> <p>Try and get everyone in the house joining in.</p>	<p>ICT- Coding</p> <p>Use coding to create your own computer game. <p>Word Hunt- Write down the alphabet on a piece of paper. Try to find 3 words beginning with each letter of the alphabet around the house/ outside your window.</p>	<p>Imaginative- Go on to Pobble365.com (used during EWIC) and choose a Title of a story to continue. Use the picture and story starter to aid your imagination. You can draw a picture of your story once you have finished.</p>	<p>Play a maths game on your computer or tablet.</p> <p>https://www.topmarks.co.uk</p>	<p>Help to make a meal – how about pizza toasts? All you need is bread, tomato puree and cheese. If that doesn't tickle your fancy you could pick a different recipe. Beans on toast? Sandwiches?</p>	<p>FRENCH- Colours</p> <p>Draw and colour-in a rainbow, label each colour with the correct French Vocabulary. Use 'French with Alexa' on Youtube to help you.</p>
<p>Choose 5 words from your word hunt and put them in to silly sentences.</p> <p>You could draw a picture of your silly sentences.</p>	<p>Newspaper Report- Watch Newsround and discuss what was reported with an adult. Create a Newspaper Article describing what is happening. Remember to keep it factual and to write in columns.</p>	<p>Practise counting in 2s, 3s, 4s, 5s, 6s, 7s and 10s. Try and get as far as you can. Challenge: Now try to count back in 2s, 3s, 4s, 5s, 6s, 7s and 10s. Bigger Challenge: start from a random number like 13.</p>	<p>Look up Cosmic Yoga on YouTube and take some time to relax. Remember to concentrate on your breathing.</p>	<p>ART</p> <p>What can you make with a cereal box? Dig out an empty cereal box and your art and craft supplies and get creative!</p>
<p>Alliteration- Alliteration is when 2 or more words begin with the same letter. For example: Peter Piper Picked a Peck of Pickled Peppers</p> <p>Can you come up with your own alliteration sentence?</p> <p>I would love to see what you come up with on SeeSaw.</p>	<p>Letter- Write a letter to an author of a book you have read explaining how you feel about the book. You should include your 3 sharings (likes/dislikes, puzzles and connections)</p> <p>Remember to also ask the author any questions you have for him/her.</p>	<p>Conduct a survey. Create a survey for your friends and family. Come up with a question (e.g. what is your favourite colour?) And possible answers (e.g. blue, red, yellow, pink and other) Ask everyone in your household and phone round other friends and family for their answers. Record information in a table using tally marks.</p>	<p>Go on to YouTube and choose a song on Just Dance to dance to. Try to get the whole family involved.</p>	<p>TOPIC- Titanic</p> <p>Morse Code was used on board the Titanic to communicate with the outside world. Use Morse Code to send a message to your family.
