

# Primary 7 At Home Activity Week

<p><b>Tiny Treasure Hunt</b></p> <p>Hunt for really small things that you can fit into a small container, e.g. a trinket box or take away Tupperware.</p> <p>Collect little leaves, blades of grass, feathers, pebbles etc.</p> <p>Turn it into a competition with your family – who can fit the most inside their box?</p> 	<p><b>Obstacle Course/ Blind Trail</b></p> <p>Create an obstacle course in your house or garden using different objects. Try it out yourself or with a family member. You could even turn it into a 'blind trail', getting people to complete it blindfolded! Make sure an adult is there to supervise and give your participant clear verbal instructions to direct them through the trail.</p> 	<p><b>Campfire Songs and Stories</b></p> <p>Sing your favourite songs outdoors and get others to join in. You could make up your own songs about what you can see/ hear/ smell etc. If anyone has an instrument at home, they could play along. You could also tell campfire stories – engaging your family with scary, theatrical story telling. You could take it in turns to add content to the story as you make your way around 'the campfire'. Do it in the dark with a torch for extra effect!</p> 	<p><b>Build a Fort/ Den</b></p> <p>Create an indoor or outdoor fort/ den using any materials you can find e.g. cushions, blankets, sheets, branches. Use your imagination. Your ideas could be based on a treehouse, blanket fort, cushion castle, teepee. This will help you develop construction and engineering skills!</p> 	<p><b>Stargazing</b></p> <p>Enjoy the night sky! Count the stars and draw the constellations you see. Try and identify those constellations. Why not try to draw the shapes you see in the sky and create your own constellations.</p> 
<p><b>Talent Show</b></p> <p>Plan and produce an 'at home' talent show. Show off one of your talents to an audience and encourage them to perform theirs. It could be any skill at all – gymnastics, art, singing, comedy. You could even have judges giving scores and a winner!</p> 	<p><b>Beat Your Score</b></p> <p>Choose an activity that you enjoy to try and 'beat your score'. It could be keepy ups, skipping, passing a ball etc. Count how many times you can repeat the activity (on your own or with a family member) and try to beat your top score.</p> 	<p><b>Nature Collage</b></p> <p>Collect interesting or odd things that catch your eye when spending time outside or out on a walk. Then with your materials, create a nature collage on paper, cardboard or even on the ground. You could create a nature scene or an image of your choice e.g. an animal. Be sure to take a picture of your creation!</p> 	<p><b>Treasure Hunt</b></p> <p>Create a treasure hunt for someone to complete with clues that will lead them around the garden/house and to a final destination.</p> 	<p><b>Mini Raft Making</b></p> <p>Using materials from around the house and garden e.g. twigs, design a small raft that will float on water.</p>
