How many pairs do you have?</p>	<p>Have a look at the PE challenge cards (you will find them in the activities section on seesaw) Can you adapt these and make a routine for your family? You could try and link the activities together and even add some music.</p>	<p>Topic With your adult's help, can you find out the name of the following animal's babies? cow, sheep, duck, horse, pig?</p>

They might be able to have a go at recognising some of the words. There is no need to print this activity out to complete.</p>	<p>Can you write a sentence/story about Jack and the Beanstalk? You could retell your favourite part of the story, describe the main characters or even change the ending.</p>	<p>Using your adult's calendar on their computer/phone, can you see how many weeks there are in April? How many Mondays, Tuesdays etc are there? Do the same for May.
