

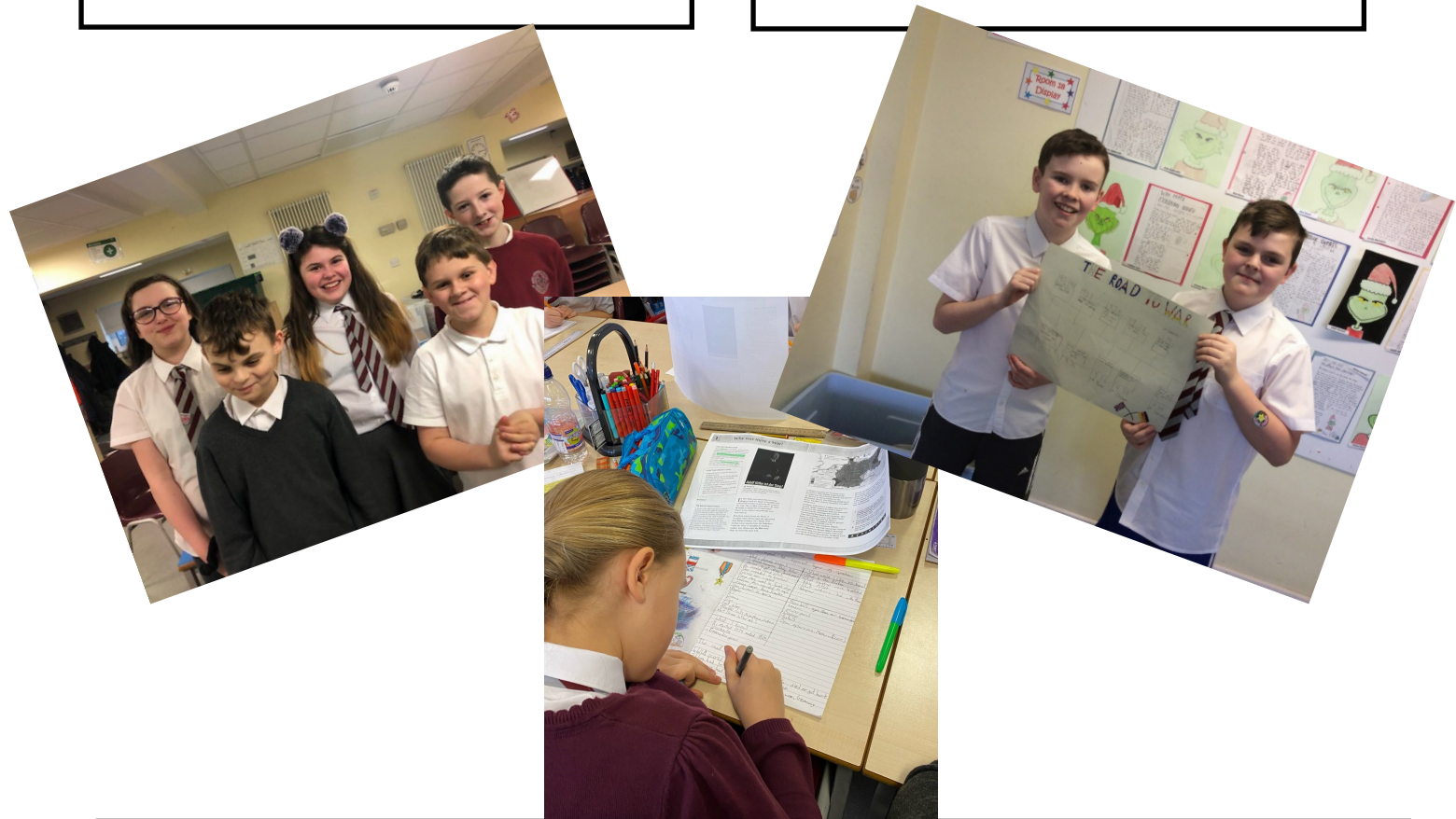
P7 Pupil Newsletter

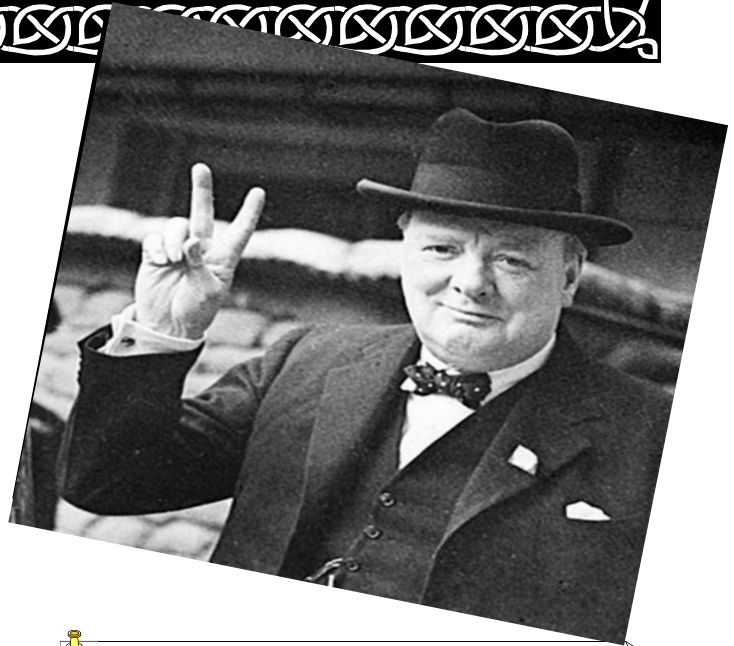

OUR TERM 3 FOCUS

This term we are really looking forward to studying World War 2. We will focus on developing the children's knowledge of the Home Front and the impact that war had on the lives of Scottish people. The children will be developing their research skills through personal and group projects and will identify bias within primary and secondary sources. Primary 7 will refine their communication and presentation skills through a variety of collaborative tasks. The topic will also provide opportunities to focus on music and drama through exploring life in the 1930s. There are also meaningful opportunities to integrate French within the topic, where children will learn new vocabulary based around countries and clothing. Children will be issued a personal project to allow personalisation and choice, where they can research an aspect of World War 2 that particularly interests them. These will be presented to the rest of the class.
