The Young Ambassadors programme is run by sport Scotland and funded through the National Lottery.</p> <p><u>The Role of the Young Ambassador</u></p> <p>At the heart of the Young Ambassador programme is the principle that their views, and those of other young people are heard, valued and influence decision making; and that they are engaged in driving change. The key role of the Young Ambassador is to motivate and inspire other young people to participate in sport and physical activity. This involves inspiring pupils aged 5-18 to participate in PE, school sport, extracurricular activities, and local activity clubs.
