Reminder



As a parent/carer, you know when your child is ill and when they're feeling better. But it's important to take steps to make sure they're well enough to return to nursery, and that they're not at risk of spreading any infection or illness. Please remember after an episode of sickness and/or diarrhoea, your child must stay off nursery for 48 hours after the last episode.

Labels on Clothing

We kindly ask that you label your child's jackets, jumpers, cardigans etc. This will ensure they don't get mixed up and it is easy for staff to return missing belongings to the correct child.

Additionally, we ask that you ensure your child has spare clothing in their locker that they have access to if necessary. Although, your child may be toilet trained, children often participate in messy and outdoor play in all weathers. Although, we have waterproof clothing and aprons, sometimes children still need to be changed throughout the session.


Disabled Parking
