Mrs Brown and I look forward to working with you all across the term and I hope that the information shared in the newsletter is useful to you. If there is anything you would like to see added please let us know!



### **AVIVA Community Fund—Playground Developments**



We are making use of 'How Good is OUR School' which allows our learners to evaluate our school and let us know where they think we need to improve. We are focusing on Health and wellbeing just now and we will share their ideas with you as we progress.

#### **REMINDERS**


A gentle reminder to ask you to support our high standards of uniform at Our Lady's. Only school jumpers should be worn in the classrooms and ties should be worn, every day.




#### SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

#### **GROWING OUR VOCABULARY**

We are taking a whole school approach to the learning of new vocabulary at Our Lady's. A new word will be introduced to the whole school every fortnight and various activities will take place in classes to encourage the children to have a deeper understanding of the word and to learn to use it in a variety of contexts.

Have a look at our display in the school foyer, by the library, which will grow as our vocabulary does or ask your child what the fortnight's word is. Encourage them to share the meaning with you and to use it in a sentence!

#### **NUMERACY AND MATHS SURVEY**

Thank you to all that took the time to complete the Numeracy and Maths Survey. Numeracy is on our School Improvement Plan this session and it is important to us to work in partnership with parents to support our learners.

54 parents responded and the survey showed that:

92% of our parents feel that maths and numeracy are important in every day life but that only 44.2% enjoyed maths at school.

51.9% feel that their child enjoys maths and 84.8% felt their child was making progress in this area.

Almost 2/3 of our parents would like to get better at maths and numeracy skills themselves and just over half felt they were informed on their child's progress.

55.8% of parents felt their child received enough numeracy homework while the remaining 44.2% would like to see more.

Just under 80% said that they would like to attend a Numeracy Workshop in order to help them better support their child at home.

We will now use this information to help us look at the best ways to support the learning of numeracy skills both in the classroom and at home. Keep a look out for updates!



Our French pen pal project with St. John's Academy is proving a huge success. Our P6 and P7 children are being challenged to develop their French reading and writing skills within a fun and meaningful context. Their current task is to plan, design and label a new school uniform in French.

This week is 'Languages Week' for schools in Perth and Kinross. At Our Lady's we have lots of learning activities planned throughout the week focusing on the Chinese New Year and French vocabulary.

Our current French Phrase of the Fortnight is:

'Je ne comprends pas' - 'I don't understand'

It is lovely to hear the children and staff using French around the school.
