St. Polycarp - Feast Day February 23rd

Polycarp, bishop of Smyrna, disciple of Saint John the Apostle and friend of Saint Ignatius of Antioch, was a revered Christian leader during the first half of the second century.

Saint Ignatius, on his way to Rome to be martyred, visited Polycarp at Smyrna, and later at Troas wrote him a personal letter. The Asia Minor Churches recognized Polycarp's leadership by choosing him as a representative to discuss with Pope Anicetus the date of the Easter celebration in Rome—a major controversy in the early Church.

Only one of the many letters written by Polycarp has been preserved, the one he wrote to the Church of Philippi in Macedonia.

At 86, Polycarp was led into the crowded Smyrna stadium to be burned alive. The flames did not harm him and he was finally killed by a dagger. The centurion ordered the saint's body burned. The "Acts" of Polycarp's martyrdom are the earliest preserved, fully reliable account of a Christian martyr's death. He died in 155.





St. Louis de Montfort on the importance of the Holy Rosary

Our entire perfection consists in being conformed, united and consecrated to Jesus Christ. Hence the most perfect of all devotions is undoubtedly that which conforms, unites and consecrates us most perfectly to Jesus Christ. Now, since Mary is of all creatures the one most conformed to Jesus Christ, it follows that among all devotions that which most consecrates and conforms a soul to our Lord is devotion to Mary, his Holy Mother, and that the more a soul is consecrated to her the more will it be consecrated to Jesus Christ... It would hardly be possible for me to put into words how much Our Lady thinks of the Holy Rosary and of how she vastly prefers it to all other devotions. Neither can I sufficiently express how highly she rewards those who work to preach the devotion, to establish it and spread it, nor on the other hand how firmly she punishes those who work against it... The Rosary is the most powerful weapon to touch the Heart of Jesus, Our Redeemer, who loves His Mother... Never will anyone who says his Rosary every day be led astray. This is a statement that I would gladly sign with my blood.

Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstinence

Ash Wednesday is <u>not</u> a holyday of obligation although you are strongly encouraged to attend Mass to begin the holy season of Lent in a fitting way. On Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays of Lent everyone of age 14 and up must abstain from consuming flesh meat. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday everyone of age 18 to 59 (inclusive) must fast, unless exempt due to usually a medical reason. Fasting consists of eating one main meal in the day and two very small snacks that together would not constitute another full meal.
