2. Apologies	Apologies were received from Julie Chambers and Karen Drummond.	
3. Head Teachers	School is very busy at the moment, with lots planned for final term.	
Report	Assemblies have started back as normal from Monday and all the kids are very happy.	
	Covid guidance for the time being means parents are still not allowed in the school building. Cases have had a natural peak, but that has settled again.	
	There is the hope to have parents at our sports day, but that will be revised at a later date.	
	The P6's have been visiting nursery to see their buddies, with no bubbles currently in place.	
	There is a hope to lift restrictions and get things back to normal – we will need to wait for further guidance to come from Scottish Government.	
	Outbreak of covid in February throughout the school and teaching staff, letters were sent to all classes involved.	

Book fayre is here on Wednesday, all the kids are very excited.	
We have £680 left of scholastic vouchers which means we can develop a 'reading spine'.	
This will consist of a collection of traditional authors and different books to widen the children's knowledge.	
$\pounds$ 1000 of school PEF money will be added to this too, bringing the total amount to $\pounds$ 1680 to be spent on books for our school.	
Each class will get their own tailored box in August 2022 of different books and authors which they can read throughout	
the year. Leaflets were sent home with which books will be available to	
buy for the pupils. Any profit from the book fayre will then in turn buy new books	
for the school.	
Parents evening seemed to be a success, with telephone appointments proving to be more popular than online.	
There was an uptake record high of 88%, compared to only	
47% of appointments in October. There is the question of what future parents night will look like.	
Possibility of a hybrid parents evening with some in person appointments, and telephone appointments to suit parents.	
This will be reviewed in August 2022 and dependent on any restrictions in place.	
School trips have been booked, with the full school going to 5 Sisters Zoo in June.	
Buses have been booked. Pupils who are registered as a free school meal will be free. Any other pupils will have the	
standard ticket charge of roughly £10 or under.	
Parent helpers will be needed, with no ticket charge to them. Letters will be sent out after the Easter holidays.	
A school panto has also been booked. The same applies with tickets. Parents will be told of this at a later date.	
The school attainment from November - March has been reviewed by Falkirk Council.	
All children are looked at individually and we are all happy with the progress being made.	
P7 transition is well underway, and the children seem very	
excited! The Broomlee trip is fast approaching also.	

	The children have now had visits with teachers from Denny High, and they will be sending pupils for a visit to the school. They will ask any collective questions and take pictures to bring back and show the rest of the class.	
	All of the P7's will have their visit to Denny High on Thursday 9th and Friday 10th of June where they make their own way there, and will follow a new timetable to get them ready for 1st year. It is a great experience for the children. The 'P7 leaving do' will be the last Friday before school	
	finishes for summer. P1 enrollments have also been done, placing requests and applications for deferred years are still being processed. There is a possibility of staffing changes due to staff on maternity leave but this information will come to HT after the Easter holidays.	
4. Uniform	The question has been asked whether parents think it would be a good idea to add a royal blue hoodie to the school P.E uniform.	
	It has been noticed that many pupils are still not sticking to school colours for P.E days so the idea of having a school hoodie for pupils to wear was brought up.	
	A hoodie from Trutex would cost around £13.	
	P6 and P7 would have a black hoodie, and P7's would have the option to have their named hoodie all year round.	
	An unbranded royal blue hoodie would be acceptable also. This way it keeps all children in the same school colours.	
	Parent Council parents voiced support for this change. Parents will be informed after the Easter holidays.	
5. Homework	Homework is being monitored, with only 81% of families accessing teams and 19% of families not doing any homework at all. Within the 81% some pupils only visit their homework page sporadically.	
	With a huge amount of teacher effort and sometimes very little return, a parent questionnaire will be offered to find out what parents would like to see in terms of homework.	

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Parents/Carers are asked to give their honest advice.
