Numeracy and Mathematics

All children will be challenged at a pace appropriate to their learning.

The children will be developing skills in:

- Matching number symbols to quantity.
- Counting objects to 20/25.
- Ordering numbers to 20/25.
- Understanding addition stories to 5/10.
- Counting backwards from 15/20.
- Consolidating the number before/after a given number.
- Data Analysis
- Capacity

Learning across the Curriculum

Social Studies and Science

The children will be learning about the weather. The children will be observing and recording the local weather over a period of time and discussing how various types of weather affect their daily lives. They will identify the changes in weather as we move through the seasons. The children will also explore the effect temperature has on water.

The children will be exploring toys from the past and comparing them to toys from today. They will also investigate different ways of making toys work eg. pushing, pulling, wind-up and batteries.

The children will be focusing on key messages from COP26 in relation to keeping our oceans litter free and healthy in order to support ocean creatures and their habitats.

Technologies

The children will be learning how to operate the digital camera to record evidence of changes in the weather and will use the touchscreen and chromebooks to access the internet to support their learning.

Outdoor and Indoor PE

Outdoor PE will be on a Monday afternoon. The children will be developing their hand and eye coordination, how to judge distance, strength and timing as they learn how to play tennis and hockey.

Indoor PE will be on a Tuesday morning. The children will be learning some party games and dances.
