

Numeracy and Mathematics

All children will be challenged at a pace appropriate to their learning.

The majority of children will be developing skills in:

- Number recognition and formation to 10.
- Matching number symbol to quantity.
- Counting objects to 10.
- Ordering numbers to 10.
- Understanding the addition stories to 10.
- Counting backwards from 10.
- Recognising the number before/after and more/less than a given number.
- Identifying odd and even numbers.
- Shape, patterns and symmetry.

We will be introducing the 5 cog model which makes links between our emotions, behaviours, triggers and identifies strategies to help overcome these.

Literacy

Children will be developing skills in:

- Phonics – learning the name and sound of each letter, blending letters together to make words and correct formation.
- Common words/spelling – to read and spell using active strategies.
- Reading books corresponding to their book band.
- Writing - they will begin to learn that letters make words and words make sentences. They will learn what is needed to construct a sentence i.e. capital letters, finger spaces and full stops. They will learn that 'and' is a connective.
- Rhyming, alliteration and syllables.
