Health and Wellbeing

Outdoor PE will be on a Wednesday afternoon. The children will be learning about fitness skills both focusing on their motor skills and developing skills to work co-operatively. Indoor PE will be on a Thursday afternoon and the children will be learning skills in gymnastics.

Children will be learning about being active. They will be learning about what makes an active lifestyle and how to ensure they are active on a daily basis. Children will also be learning about mindset and how to care for their mental health. We continue to work on understanding our emotion through our Emotion Works programme.

- phonics and spelling, using a variety of active spelling strategies to enhance learning or exploring phonemes, common words and spelling rules, using a variety of active spelling strategies to enhance learning
- developing handwriting skills
- reading, developing their understanding of a text using different reading strategies through exploring a variety of texts (fiction and non-fiction)
- writing, developing vocabulary and structure.
- exploring and creating personal, imaginative and functional pieces of writing
- literacy through our class novel and non-fiction texts
- Scots language through stories and poems

Learning across the Curriculum
