<u>Next Term – Information for P1 pupils</u>

We are very excited to welcome our new Primary 1s to Bankier Primary in August. As discussed in our virtual transition meeting we have draft plans in place for their first day which is subject to the restrictions at that point. The children will come to the front gate and enter the playground between 9.10am and 9.30am. This will avoid the busy 9am drop off which may overwhelm many children. One adult can accompany the child into the playground where they will have the opportunity for a brief photograph, say their goodbyes to their parent and then be welcomed into school by the staff. They can then be collected by one parent in the infant playground at 2.45pm.

All of these details will be confirmed by email the week before we return to school.

You have shown respect for one another by washing hands, bringing lunches in disposable containers and maintaining physical distance.
