Our School App will be used to send updates such as this one whilst our social media accounts on Twitter and Facebook will continue to show an insight into the day-to-day life of our school. Our current school website hosts important information such as the previously mentioned Learning Grids and information that is of use during this period will be put into the January 2021 section of the page titled "Resources".

The S2 options choice process is due to take place in the coming weeks and more information will follow about this next week. This will not be in the same format as previous years so watch this space to see what Mr Clancy has planned!

Again, given the current restrictions it cannot go ahead in the usual format but we are also looking at trialling some different systems to make this experience as straightforward as possible.
