Dear parents and carers,

A very warm welcome to the October 2021 edition of Academy News. I'm delighted to be able to share with you a flavour of the many 'goings-on' at Eastbank over the last eight weeks. It has been an incredibly fast and busy term so far!

In August I was relieved and happy to see that the SQA had accepted our estimates and had awarded our young people the qualifications we informed them they merited. Summer 2020 was quite a stressful term, and I'd like to congratulate all the young people for their resilience and hard work in getting through their assessments. I'm also grateful to the staff who had to work incredibly hard to get the pupils through these. Well done to all! This week we were able to personally congratulate *some* of these young people at our awards ceremony. The continuing restrictions meant we were unable to include as many as we would have liked, but we're hopeful for next year.

On the staffing front, we welcomed a number of new colleagues to Eastbank this session, including our new DHT Dr Leigh-Ann Scott. Dr Scott will have responsibility for first year, learning and teaching, and a number of other strategic priorities. I look forward to working with all our new colleagues in the months and years ahead.

I'm very hopeful that we will have an uninterrupted, lockdown-free academic session this year. As we always do, we spend considerable time evaluating and reflecting on our work, and identifying what we can do to improve. Some of this involves seeking the views of parents, carers and young people, and I'm pleased that so many were able to respond to our survey in the summer. As a result of this self-evaluation, we have planned a number of improvements for the coming session, and these can be found in our School Improvement Plan, a copy of which can be found on our school website <u>here</u>. It is my expectation that by implementing these improvements we will be better able to meet the needs, and improve outcomes, for your sons and daughters going forward.

On the academic front, S4, S5 and S6 pupils received their first tracking report this week. S2 and S3 will receive theirs at the end of this month, with S1 following thereafter. These will be issued regularly throughout the year to keep you informed about your child's academic progress and prospects. I'm hopeful that we'll be able to reintroduce parental consultations in some form this year.

The time between October and Christmas will be fast and furious. SQA exams are scheduled to go ahead in the summer, and in preparation for this we will be holding prelims for S4-S6 pupils in December. There are seven teaching weeks until these begin, so everyone will need to be working hard and stay 'on the ball'.

Before I close I must thank Miss Kennedy, who is leading on the publication of Academy News in Miss Reilly's absence, and from which we all benefit! I'm sure you'll enjoy this edition of Academy News. I wish everyone a wonderful October holiday, and look forward to working with you in the term ahead.
