SCHOOL CLOSURES

As of Monday 16th March, 3pm, there is no plan to close schools in Scotland. (Source: <https://www.bbc.co.uk/news/uk-scotland-51802554>)

You may be aware that Perth High School will be closed for three days after a person connected to the institution was told to isolate after displaying symptoms of coronavirus. The school will undergo a deep clean and is expected to reopen to students on Thursday.

PREVENTION

All staff and pupils are being encouraged and advised to maintain good hand hygiene and 'catch it, bin it, kill it' if coughing or sneezing.

IF YOUR CHILD HAS SYMPTOMS

On 13 March the Scottish Government announced that anyone developing symptoms consistent with COVID-19 should self-isolate for 7 days. The most common symptoms are:

- new continuous cough and/or
- high temperature

If symptoms worsen during home isolation or are no better after 7 days then people should be advised to phone their GP or NHS24 (111). SCHOOL EXCURSIONS

On 12/3/2020 the Scottish Government advised that all foreign school excursions should not go ahead. There was no end date on this action but it is inevitable that our excursion to Iceland will be cancelled and we are currently establishing if the Perth and Kinross insurance covers refunds or rescheduling. Our excursion to France and Spain do not take place until May and June respectively but there is also a chance that these too may be cancelled or postponed.

Advice is not currently advising against domestic trips. However, as we have several UK based excursions planned over the next few months, we have made the decision to cancel

all excursions between now and the Easter holidays. Any excursion planned for term 4 and session 2020-21 will be reviewed as the picture becomes clearer. We have halted all plans for any further excursions next session at this time.

SQA EXAMINATIONS

In the interim we are adjusting timetables so that pupils can meet SQA deadlines and staff are considering what evidence they have for pupils in the event that exceptional circumstances policy is enacted if examinations are cancelled (although there is NO suggestion of this at present).
